COLONEL GLENN COLLINS

Col. Glenn Collins is the commander of the 932nd Airlift Wing, an Air Force Reserve Command unit located at Scott Air Force Base, Ill. He is responsible for training and equipping more than 1,300 reservists with four C-40C distinguished visitor aircraft. His previous assignment was Assistant Deputy Director of Operations and Nuclear Integration for Air Mobility Command, where he assisted the director of policy and procedures for rapid global mobility, air operations, and transportation functions assigned to the command. He also served as Reserve Advisor to the AMC Director of Operations, the National Security Fellowship at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., and Commander of the 95th Airlift Squadron, a C-130H2 unit based at Pope Field, N.C.

Col. Collins is a 1981 graduate of the Choate School and a 1985 graduate of Brown University. He received his commission in 1988 while attending Boston College Law School. He served for two years as an intelligence officer before attending Army flight training. Assignments thereafter included command of an aviation detachment and an aviation company. In 1999 he transferred to the Air Force Reserve. Col. Collins



served as a Flight Commander and Chief Pilot before assuming command of the 95th Airlift Squadron in 2011. He is a Command Instructor Pilot with more than 3,600 hours and has served in numerous contingency operations, including Operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, Joint Enterprise and Coronet Oak. He has qualified in nine different military aircraft, both fixed and rotary wing.

While a Citizen Airman, Col. Collins maintained a private law practice with an emphasis in aviation litigation. He additionally served as the aviation analyst for a major television network in Chicago and is on the board of directors for several philanthropic, civic and business organizations.
