COLONEL RAYMOND A. SMITH, JR.

Col Raymond A. Smith, Jr., is the Commander, 932d Airlift Wing, Scott Air Force Base, Ill. He is responsible for ensuring the wing executes its mission of providing mission-ready citizen-airman supporting national interests worldwide through Distinguished Visitor airlift, expeditionary combat support, and ground and aeromedical care..

Col Smith is a graduate of Northern Kentucky University and entered active duty through the United States Army Warrant Officer Flight Training program. He graduated from rotary wing pilot training at Fort Rucker, Ala., and was assigned to Fort Campbell, Ky., as an UH-60A medical evacuation "DUSTOFF" pilot. In 1993, he was awarded a direct commission to lieutenant and reassigned to the 236th Medical Company (Air Ambulance), Landstuhl, Germany, where the colonel performed as a flight commander. After his deployment to Bosnia and Herzegovina in 1996, he was awarded an interservice transfer to the United States Air Force and served as an HH-60G combat search and rescue pilot stationed at Moody Air Force Base, Ga., and Patrick AFB, Fla. Colonel Smith began fixed-wing qualification in 2004 and has served the strategic airlift community since 2005. His duties have included group commander, operations officer, chief of safety, scheduling, tactics, training and mobility. He also served as the assistant director of operations and plans officer for an operational support squadron.



Col Smith has flown more than 5,500 hours in the H-60, C-5, C-17 and C-40, and held instructor ratings in helicopters and fixed wing. He has been the rescue flight lead for manned/unmanned space flight support missions and deployed eight times to support combat/humanitarian missions across the globe. He has supported Operations JOINT ENDEAVOR, SOUTHERN WATCH, NORTHERN WATCH, ATLAS RESPONSE, IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM, INHERENT RESOLVE and FREEDOM SENTINEL.
