COLONEL MICHAEL S. MALONEY

Colonel Michael S. Maloney is the Commander of the 932d Operations Group, Scott Air Force Base, Illinois. He leads a group of 225 military and civilian personnel in three squadrons and one flight. The group has two main missions: aeromedical evacuation and executive airlift. The 932d Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron provides combat-ready medical professionals capable of evacuating ill and injured persons within 24-hours of notification. The 73d Airlift Squadron and the 54th Airlift Squadron fly Air Force Reserve Command's VIPSAM mission on four C-40C aircraft, providing world-class transportation for our nation's military and civilian leaders to destinations around the world.

Colonel Maloney was commissioned through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps at the University of Missouri. He began his career as a navigator and electronic warfare officer in the B-52H at Barksdale AFB before graduating from pilot training in 2002. He was assigned to the 711th Special Operations Squadron as an MC-130E and C-145 pilot. Colonel Maloney has also been assigned as the Wing Inspector General and Director of Inspections and has deployed to Entebbe Uganda as the Commander of the Joint Special Operations Detachment-Uganda and the 5th Expeditionary Special Operations Squadron. Finally, Colonel Maloney has been the Chief, Foreign Language Training and Senior Director, Air Force Special Operations Command and the USAFE/AFAF liaison officer to US Africa Command. Colonel Maloney is a Command Pilot with more than 5,000 military and civilian hours flying the MC-130E, C-145 and C-40C aircraft.
